Broken Bay Cross Country Champions ships

Last week on Tuesday 21st May, the following eight students, Ranbir, Sophia, Floyd, Emma, Isla, Annabelle, Caryne and Oscar represented our school at the Broken Bay Cross Country Championships at The Entertainment Grounds at Gosford.

Here is a recount by Isla about her experience of the day:

Cross country is a race run through bush and up and down hills – however this course was flat and was literally on a racecourse for horses. I was very nervous, but I felt better when I saw my friend, Annabelle. This was the Broken Bay trials and in my race, it was top ten to qualify. The zone managers sang the National Anthem and said a prayer.

Right before the whistle blew, one of the girls made a false start which caused me to be a bit confused, but I just kept running. When the orange cones led off the finish line, a couple of girls had overtaken me, but I sprinted ahead and came 14th place out of 58 8/9-year-old girls. I stayed to watch the presentation and 1st, 2nd & 3rd were given medals! After that, I bought a nice, cold, refreshing ice cream. I ran a personal best time. My race was the youngest age group, but it went all the way up to 18-year-old – who had to run 8km (I only ran 2km). I hope next year I will make it to the next level.

On behalf of the school, I would like to congratulate all eight students for trying their best on the day and showing great determination in finishing the race. We are so proud of you all for making it this far into the cross-country trials. Well done, to you all!


