From the Advisory Council



Book Club



Reminder: How to Order Book Club at OLD

There are 2 issues of Book Club each term.

They are in the form of brochure / magazine with books and prices.

The issue that will be coming home this week is Issue 5.





Steps:

- Your child will bring home a Scholastic Book Club Catalogue from school.
- 2. Buying is completely optional and can be a one-off purchase. (No ongoing commitment).
- 3. Discuss and share the books in the catalogue to see if any are of interest to your child.
- Order books ONLINE using the Scholastic Australia LOOP website or app. The school will
 take care of the rest! (LOOP orders are electronically linked to our school in a secure
 online process). No cash payments at school, all orders are completed at home.
- Books will be delivered directly to school at the close of the Book Club period. Normally
 this lasts a few weeks to allow for browsing and selection. Books are handed out to
 students to take home.

If you are new to Book Club you will need to follow the steps at this above site to set up a new profile - this includes:

- · Clicking the ORDER tab and selecting your child's class / class teacher
- Adding your child's name
- · Entering the product item number (from the catalogue)
- Make payment via credit card


