



Scholastic Book Fair

Once again, OLD will host a Scholastic Book Fair event. All students will have the chance to browse the books at the Fair during their regular Library lessons. This will take place in Week 6 (August 28th-30th). Classes can record a "wish list" of any items of interest. Buying books from the fair is completely optional and a wish list does not commit to buying any books. Popular books may need to be re-ordered and these are delivered by Scholastic to the school as soon as it is possible. A small percentage of all funds raised go towards our Scholastic Reward dollars - we use these to purchase books for our school Library as well as classroom readers and resources.
