Isla 4B



Blessed Carlo - our first Millennial Saint



Carlo was born on the 3rd May 1991 in London and was baptised on the 18th May at Our Lady of Dolours. Later that year his family returned to Milan. At a young age Carlo showed a special love for God even though his parents were not practicing Catholics.

Carlo loved to pray the Rosary and after he made his first Holy Communion he went to Mass as often as possible at the parish across from his elementary school.

Carlo's love for the Eucharist inspired his mother devotion. The priest promoting his cause for sainthood because he "managed to drag his relatives, his parents to Mass every day. It was not the other way around; it was not his parents bringing the little boy to Mass, but it was he who managed to get himself to Mass and to convince others to receive Communion daily."

He had a gift for empathy and was known for defending kids at school who were bullied or picked on, especially those who could not stand up for themselves. With his extraordinary faith at such a young age, Carlo was still a boy like any other, he loved Soccer, Pokémon, Spiderman and Video Games. He also played the saxophone. He is a great inspiration to our young children, to have faith and be caring to others.






