


Saint Patricks day

OLD TV



Did you know Our Lady of Dolours is a priority feeder school for:

Mercy Catholic College, Chatswood, St Leo's Catholic College, Wahroonga and St Paul's Catholic College, Manly.

OLD is a priority feeder school for Mercy College, St Leo's and St Paul's but it is important that families wishing to enrol their child for Year 7 do so within the enrolment periods.

Applications for Year 7 2027 will close on 1st May 2025. I would also strongly encourage families seeking to secure a place for 2028 to put their applications in as soon as possible.

At our first ever School Advisory Council Meeting for the year 2025, we warmly welcomed new members to the council and reviewed the terms of reference.

Important updates on the school's annual plan outlining the key focus on 'Empower every student' through collaborative coaching, promoting quality teaching and learning were discussed.

Strong and positive outcomes for the enrolments of years 2025 and 2026, creative and impactful promotional strategies and the school's finances were reviewed and discussed.

The successful roll out of the new school uniforms, by overcoming some initial difficulties was touched upon and necessary communication to support families through this transition was shared.

New tech (laptops to replace chrome books), reading and well-being resources are being procured by the school.

Essential transformation works carried out across the school last year and the ongoing works this year were touched upon.
